Brown Bag Program

The Brown Bag program is for people over the age of 55 who meet certain income guidelines (\$1,872.00 for 1 or \$2,538.00 for 2 monthly). If you qualify for SSI, Medicaid, Fuel Assistance, Veteran's Aid or have a documented disability for which you receive SSDI, you may qualify to receive Brown Bag monthly groceries.

The Food Bank of Western Massachusetts delivers the food to our Senior Center on the 3rd Tuesday of each month. Brown Bag pick-up is from 1:00 P.M. until 3:00 P.M. Each bag contains a healthy mix of fruits, protein, vegetables, dairy and grains.

SNAP for Seniors

The Massachusetts Food Stamp Program, now called the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) has been streamlined for seniors.

Even if you've never applied for assistance, or have been ineligible in the past, here are some reasons to consider applying for SNAP today:

If your monthly income is below the following limits, there is no asset test:

- \$1,307.00 for a household of one
- \$1,760 .00 for a household of two

During these difficult economic times, even a modest monthly SNAP benefit can help to offset some of your household expenses.

Using SNAP benefits is completely confidential. SNAP recipients use a card which works just like a debit card.

If you spend more than \$35 per month on medical expenses including medications and doctor's visits, you may qualify for a \$90 standard deduction. This deduction could result in a higher monthly SNAP benefit.

The Federal government says food stamps are "an entitlement". This means every eligible person has a right to food stamps. There are enough food stamps for everyone.
